Each year that I have been at Mohr School as your Principal, a rumor starts circulating in the community about my intention to retire as Principal of this great school. Most often, people are very surprised to find out that there was no truth to what they had heard.

This year, the rumor becomes truth. I have decided, after much deliberation and emotion, to retire from the Pleasanton Unified School District effective June 30, 2008. I have served your community for 37 years as a teacher (15), Vice Principal/ program coordinator (4), and Principal of Vintage Hills (8) and Mohr (10). Each of my years in Pleasanton contains memories that I will keep with me for the rest of my life. Accomplishments of the schools, students and teachers with whom I have worked are many and wonderful. My years at Mohr are the freshest and contain some of the most memorable moments and events.



Mohr School is unique in many ways. The amalgam of outstanding students, teachers, staff, parents and district, provide a formula for success. I hope that my contributions to that formula have helped make Mohr the great school that it is. It takes a great amount of dedication and determination to build a school rated 18th in the state among all elementary schools (5,500). Thank you for all of your support through my ten-year run as your Principal.

A selection and transition process for the new Principal is to be determined by the Superintendent, Dr. John Casey. I will fully cooperate with the person lucky enough to become the next leader of our school.

There is a lot to be done the rest of this year, and we need to keep our attention on the goal of teaching to our future, the children of Mohr School.

This was due to recent news coverage of potentially unhealthy processing of beef by one vendor in southern California. We have received notification that all of the district's stocks of meat products have been purged of product from this vendor.

Effective immediately, all menu items that include beef will resume and substitute menu selections will cease. All meat served will come from other vendors deemed safe by health authorities. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Kindergarten Round-Up

March 12th and 13th, 2008, 3:30pm – 8:00pm
Amador High School Gym, 1155 Santa Rita Road



Parents are encouraged to enroll kindergarten-age students in the District either Wednesday, March 12th or Thursday, March 13th. This registration period is important for the District to determine the number of kindergarten classes necessary for the following school year. Children are eligible for kindergarten if they will have reached 5 years of age on or before December 2 of the school year they enter.

Documents necessary to register new kindergarten students:

1. **Acceptable proof of residency: (two of the following)** current utility bill (within 2 months) such as PG&E, water, telephone, garbage or cable TV; or rental/lease agreement signed within the last 2 months (with name, address & telephone number of lesser); or final escrow papers signed within the last 2 months. If registration pre-dates the start of school attendance by more than one month, a second utility bill may be requested after the first month of student attendance. **Unacceptable proof of residency includes:** bank statement, driver's license, credit card bills, personal check, property tax statement, mortgage statement, AFDC statement or cell phone statement.
2. Proof of birth (birth certificate, copy of baptismal record or passport.) Student must be 5 years of age on or before December 2 of the school year they enter.
3. Documentation of immunizations (signed by a doctor.)
4. Recommended: Parents' or legal guardian's employment information.

Children entering public school for the first time are to have a dental check-up by May 31st of the first school year. The evaluation must be completed by a licensed dental professional.

PTA PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Before I get carried away, this is the time of the year that we as a PTA need to start thinking about leadership for the coming school year. Because of your involvement, Mohr PTA has been able to make so many wonderful contributions to our students and our school this year and we want to put ourselves in the best possible position to do the same again next year.

During the next couple of months our Nominating Committee will conduct their annual recruitment for the following Executive Board positions: **President, Executive Vice-President, VP of Programs and Services, VP of Membership, VP of Legislature, Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary and Parliamentarian.** Below is a description of each position.



President: Includes the responsibility to lead the school PTA toward specific goals chosen by the membership. There are the following meetings the President must attend monthly: Executive Board, Association, Pleasanton Council and the Parent Communication Council meetings.

Exec. Vice President: Serve as the primary aide to the President. Performs the duties of the President in the absence or disability of that officer to act. Attend the above-mentioned meetings in the absence of the President.

Secretary: Keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings of the association and the Exec. Board in a bound book, which is the legal record of the PTA. Perform such other duties as may be delegated.

Treasurer: Keep such permanent books of account and records of all receipts and the disbursements perform all bookkeeping and accounting functions of the PTA. Prepare all financial reports; pay all authorized bills, and present monthly financial reports at the monthly membership meeting.

Financial Secretary: Deposit all monies received by the school PTA, keep accurate records of all deposits for filing with the Treasurer's financial records for the Association. Present a monthly report with the Treasurer's report at the Association meetings.

VP of Programs and Services: This individual will be the liaison between the Committee Chairs and the President to

ensure that all planned fundraisers/events have chairs and that chairs follow appropriate PTA insurance guidelines. They will keep the President and board apprised of all fundraising/event details. Stays current with upcoming grants, awards etc.

VP of Membership: Responsible for conducting a membership campaign. Keep record of current membership and volunteer hours.

VP of Legislature: Responsible for keeping membership aware of legislation in the State and National PTA. Reports information from School Board meetings to the membership at the monthly Association meetings.

Parliamentarian: (this is an appointed position from the PTA President) attend all meetings of the Association and the Exec. Board and give necessary advice in parliamentary procedure when requested. Assist with the nomination/election committee and chair the By-Laws committee.

Health and Wellness

March 16-22 is National Poison Prevention Week.



The basic theme for this week is "**Children Act Fast...So Do Poisons!**" This means that parents must always be watchful when household chemicals or drugs are being used. Many incidents happen when adults are using a product but are distracted (for example, by the telephone or the doorbell) for a few moments. Children act fast, and adults must make sure that household chemicals and medicines are stored away from children at all times.

The American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) and the Home Safety Council (HSC) recommends the following **Poison Prevention tips**:

- Walk through the rooms where harmful products are most commonly stored, especially the kitchen, bathrooms and garage. Know what things in and around your home could poison you.
- Put child safety locks on cabinets to safely store cleaners, medicines, cosmetics, chemicals and other poisons.
- Use child-resistant closures on medicines and other products and always keep all medications (both prescription, nonprescription, and dietary supplements) in their original child-resistant containers.
- Always call medicine "medicine". Avoid calling medicine "candy" in order to get the child to take it.
- Avoid putting medicines in open trash containers. This is especially important in the kitchen or bathroom because many adult medications can be deadly to small children.
- Do not mix household products together because their contents could react with dangerous results.
- Install a carbon monoxide (CO) detector near the bedrooms and the furnace (at least 15 feet away) to warn you of high levels of CO, a deadly gas you cannot see or smell. The gas collects when fuels are burned. Too much collected gas can harm you.
- Have a service person check heaters, stoves and fireplaces every year to see that they work well.
- If you think someone has been poisoned from a medicine or household chemical, call **1-800-222-1222** for your Poison Control Center. This national toll-free number works from anyplace in the U.S. 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week. Keep the number on your phone. It will connect you to a poison control center. The Center personnel are familiar with the toxicity (how poisonous it is) of most substances found in the home or know how to find this information. It's free, private, and can save you a trip to the emergency room. If medicine has been swallowed, **do not give anything by mouth until advised by the Poison Control Center.**
